The Northern Territory had the second largest proportion of tourism businesses as a share of total businesses at **14.9%**



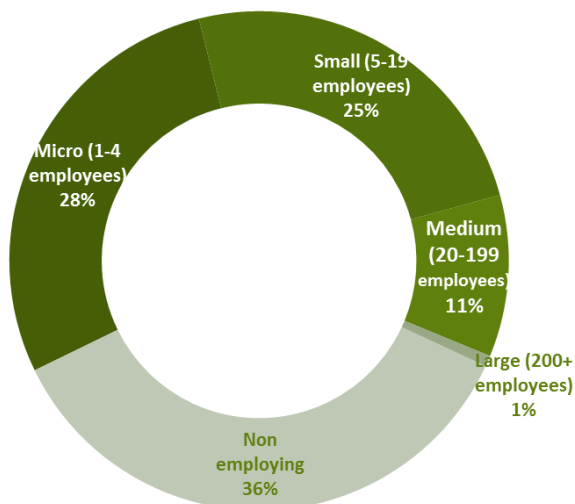

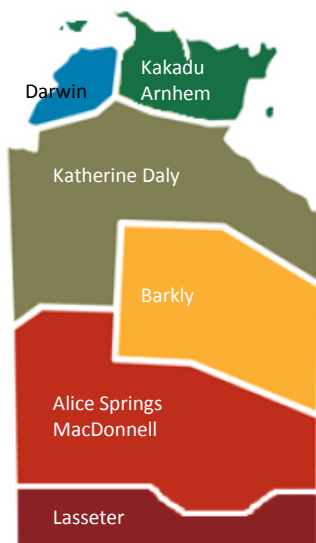
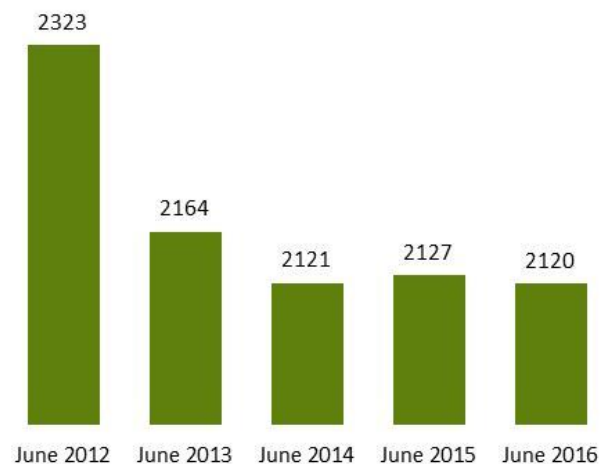

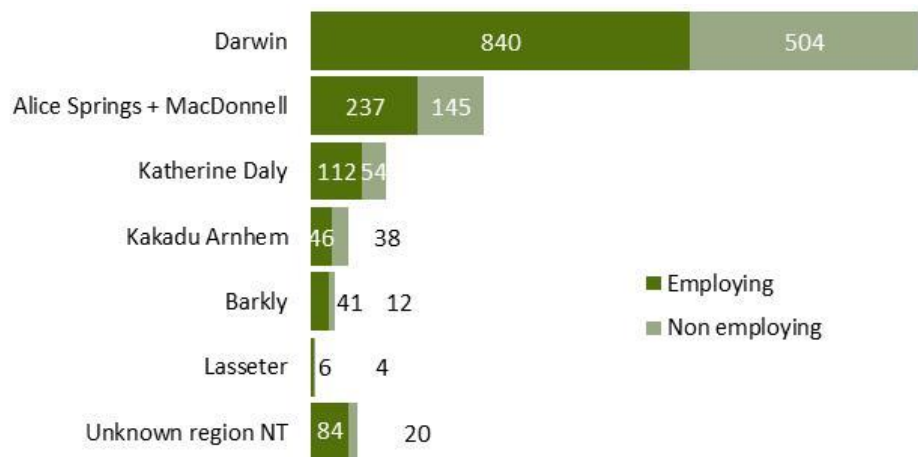
BUSINESS SIZE PROPORTIONS IN THE NORTHERN TERRITORY, JUNE 2016
