

TRADE FACT SHEET : ARNHEM LAND



Arnhem Land is one of the Top End's most spectacular natural destinations. Its scenery is beautiful and diverse, including rugged coastlines, remote islands, rivers teeming with fish, lush rainforest, towering escarpments and savannah woodland. Arnhem Land offers more than you may expect!



Getting There

East Arnhem Land has daily direct flight access from Darwin and Cairns with Air North and Qantas to Gove.

To make your way into West Arnhemland, you have the option of driving via 4WD or a short charter flight. Alternatively, there are a number of great escorted tour options into the region



Getting Around

To explore Arnhem Land by car, a 4WD must be used. The region is largely untouched and as such, sealed roads are not always available.

Touring is a fantastic option in Arnhem Land with many eco-tours encompassing indigenous culture and art, birds, flora and fauna.

- Stock up on supplies when driving through the Arnhem Land as rest stops are quite far apart
- Encourage a four wheel driving trip through the iconic landscapes of East Arnhem Land



Weather

The cool season and best time to visit is from May through to August.

During these months the maximum temperature averages sit below 30°C.

December is the hottest month when average maximum temperatures can reach is 37°C.
