Tourism Businesses in the Northern Territory June 2021




Overview

In June 2021, there were 1,443 employing tourism businesses in the Northern Territory (NT). Of Australian states and territories, the NT along with Tasmania had the largest proportion of employing tourism businesses as a share of total employing businesses, at 22%. This was above the national average of 19%. The growth was predominantly in micro businesses in the NT and across Australia.


